San Francisco Bay Area
Rapid Transit (BART) rail service connects the San Francisco Peninsula with Oakland, Berkeley, Emeryville, Walnut Creek, Dublin/Pleasanton, and other cities in the East Bay, as well as San Francisco International Airport (SFO) and Oakland International Airport (OAK).

Fare Information

Current fares can be found near ticket vending machines, online at bart.gov, or using the official BART app. BART fares can be paid by using Clipper. Adult fares can also be paid by using a contactless credit or debit card or mobile payment method, such as Apple Pay and Google Pay.

CLIPPER®

Clipper is the Bay Area's all-in-one way to pay for transit fares. Cash value can be added to Clipper and used for various Bay Area transit operators. Clipper cards can be purchased at fare machines in all BART stations. There is a one-time \$3.00 fee to setup Clipper. Or, load Clipper onto a phone with Apple Pay or Google Pay.

A minimum value is required to enter the BART system, so it is best to load fare on your card before entering. Each passenger must have their own physical Clipper card.

Trains Without Direct Service

For Train	Transfer
Antioch	Take Richmond train, then transfer at 19th St./Oakland Station.
Daly City	When direct trains to Daly City are not operating, take Richmond train, then transfer at Bay Fair Station.
Dublin/Pleasanton	Take Richmond train, then transfer at Bay Fair Station.
Millbrae	• Take Daly City train, when direct trains to Daly City are operating and then transfer to Millbrae/SFO train at Balboa Park Station. • Take Richmond train, when direct trains to Daly City are not operating. Then, transfer to Daly City train at Bay Fair Station and transfer to SFO train at Balboa Park Station. Then, transfer at San Francisco International Airport Station to Millbrae train.
OAK Int'l Airport	Take Richmond or Daly City train, then transfer at Coliseum Station. • When direct trains to Daly City are operating, take Daly City train, then, transfer to SFO train at Balboa Park Station. • When direct trains to Daly City are not operating, take the Richmond train to Bay Fair Station. There, take the Daly City train to Balboa Park Station. Then, transfer to SFO/Millbrae train.

• Children under 5 ride free.
• Seniors: Passengers 65+ or older must show proof of age with a valid driver's license, DMV ID card, Medicare card photo ID, Regional Transit Connection (RTC) Discount Photo ID, or passport. Disabilities: Passengers must show proof of disability with a valid DMV Photo ID, RTC Discount Photo ID card, DMV Parking Placard ID plus photo ID, or disability license plate registration.

• Automatically applied on the 3rd trip. Valid for unlimited local rides from time activated.

• Transbay-to-local transfer fee and only available when using Clipper. Applies to local 1st and 2nd bus when boarded within 1.5 hours. Also applies to local-to-transbay transfer.

• Available on Clipper (Senior and RTC Discount cards) or as a sticker to affix on RTC Discount cards.



Transit Information

Union City Station

511 Real-Time Departures
511 provides free, up-to-the-minute departure times for the transit agencies to the left that have this symbol. Other Bay Area transit agencies will be added in the future.

To find out when your next bus or train will depart, check nearby displays or simply call 511 and say "Departure Times." You'll then be asked to enter your stop ID number. If you don't know it, you can say your agency name, and the system will prompt you to enter your route and stop. 511 will respond with departure times for your route and will also include the stop ID online for future use. You may also look up your stop's ID online at 511.org.

Bicycles on Rail/Ferry: Bicycles are allowed on all Bay Area ferries and nearly all rail lines. Exceptions are San Francisco Muni Metro, historic streetcars, and cable cars. Buses: Nearly all Bay Area public transit buses are equipped with bicycle racks.
