Altamont Corridor Express (ACE)

The Altamont Corridor Express (ACE) service provides weekday and Saturday commuter trains along the Altamont Corridor. ACE trains additionally stop at Santa Clara, Fremont, Pleasanton, Livermore, Vasco Road, Tracy, and Lathrop/Manteca. For more information visit www.acerail.com or call 1-800-411-RAIL.

ACE operates free shuttles every weekday to provide convenient connections with major employment sites in Santa Clara County. Shuttles are scheduled to provide service immediately following the first three morning ACE train arrivals with timely return service in the evening. Shuttles will arrive after the fourth incoming train and passengers should expect to wait for shuttles. All vehicles operating this service have bike racks, are lift-equipped, and are accessible to persons with disabilities.

Fare Information effective January 2, 2019

Table with ACE Fares: From Great America to: Destination Station, One-Way, Round Trip. Includes Santa Clara, Fremont, Tri-Valley, Vasco, Livermore, & Pleasanton, Tracy, Lathrop/Manteca, Stockton.

Please purchase an ACE ticket before boarding the train. Bicycles may be carried on board for free.

Discount Fares: Approximately 50% off regular fares for passengers with disabilities, Medicare passengers, seniors 65 or older, and children ages 6-12.

Table with ACE/VTA Free Shuttles: Mon-Fri. Columns include Departure Times, Arrival Times at Final Stop, Final Stop Location. Lists various shuttle routes like Brown Shuttle to North San Jose, etc.

Shuttles will wait for the first three incoming trains.
Shuttles will arrive after the fourth incoming train and passengers should expect to wait for shuttles.
All times are approximate due to varying traffic conditions.



Amtrak Capitol Corridor

Capitol Corridor intercity rail serves 18 stations along a 170-mile rail corridor, and offers a convenient way to travel between the Sierra Foothills, Sacramento, the San Francisco Bay Area and Silicon Valley/San Jose. For information call 1-877-9-RIDECC or visit capitolcorridor.org.

Fare Information effective June 9, 2014

Amtrak tickets are purchased for the length of each passenger's journey. Advanced reservations are recommended. Please call 1-800-USA-RAIL (1-800-872-7245) or visit amtrak.com to purchase tickets.

At the train station, tickets may be purchased by credit card using a Quik-Trak kiosk located near the train platform or from the Amtrak mobile app.

In limited circumstances, tickets may be paid for onboard by cash or credit card, but only the full, undiscounted, unrestricted fare is offered.

Children ages 2-12 years ride half-price. Infants under 2 ride free.

Train to Transit Transfers

Ride VTA for free from Great America Station or Lick Mill Station. Just show a valid same-day Capitol Corridor train ticket to the bus operator or fare inspector.

Table with VTA FARES: Cash Fares, Prepaid Fares. Includes Adult (ages 18-64), Adult Express, Youth (ages 5-18), Senior/Disabled/Medicare.

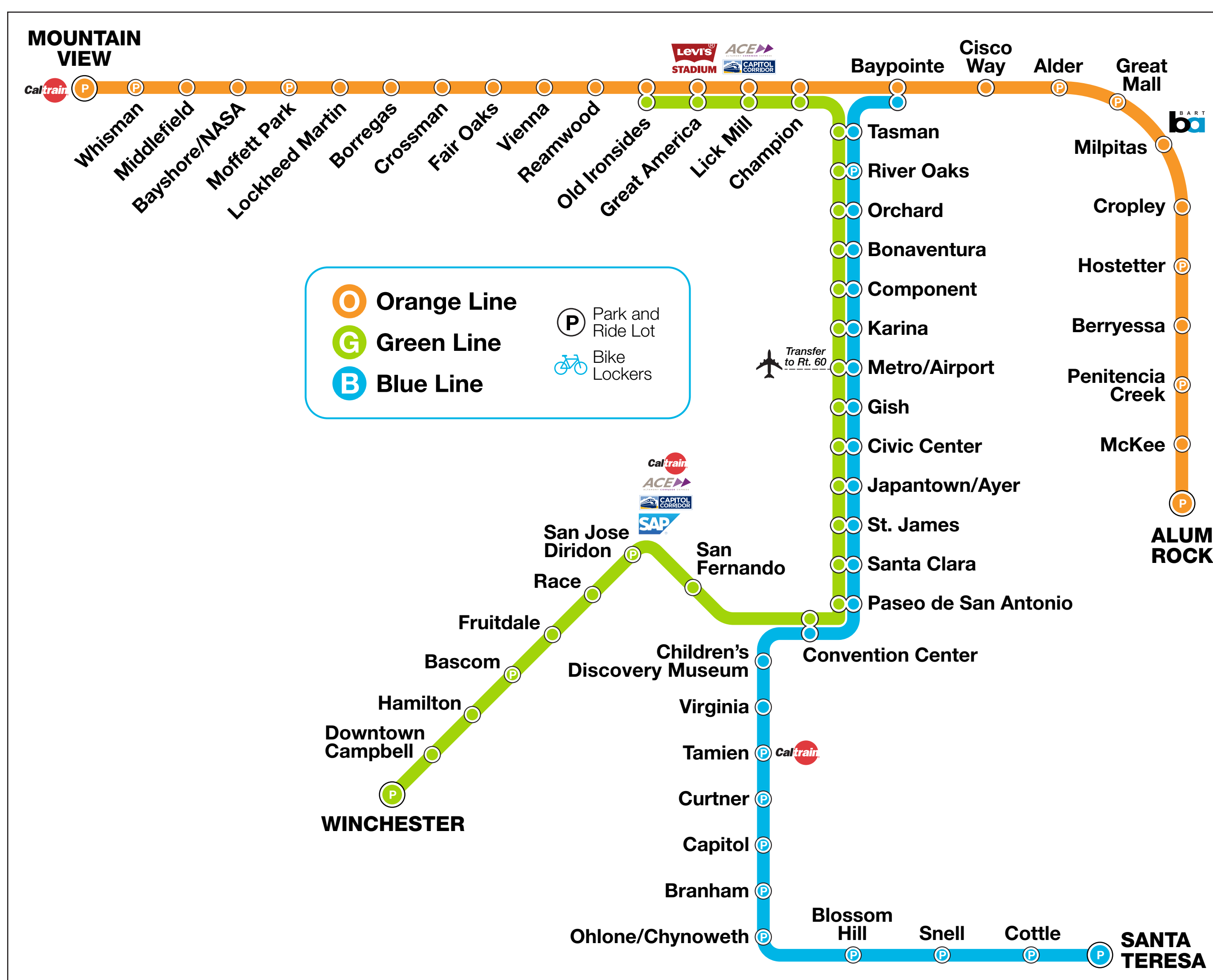
Fare evasion can result in fines and/or incarceration per CA Penal Code 483 or 640.
Children under 5 years ride free. Youth 5-18 years old, may ride VTA Express Bus service without an upgrade.

VTA Day Passes only available on Clipper*. Day Pass Accumulator feature which ensures the Clipper* cash rider will never pay more than the price of a Day Pass.
VTA Monthly Passes are only available on Clipper*.

511 Real-Time Departures

511 provides free, up-to-the-minute departure times for the transit agencies to the left that have this symbol. Other Bay Area transit agencies will be added in the future.

To find out when your next bus or train will depart, check nearby displays or simply call 511 and say "Departure Times." You'll then be asked to enter your Stop ID number. If you don't know it, you can say your agency name, and the system will prompt you to enter your route and stop. 511 will respond with departure times for your route and will also include the Stop ID for future use. You may also look up your stop's ID online at 511.org.

Bicycles on Transit

Rail/Ferries: Bicycles are allowed on all Bay Area ferries and nearly all rail lines. Exceptions are San Francisco Muni Metro, historic streetcars, and cable cars.

Buses: Nearly all Bay Area public transit buses are equipped with bicycle racks.
General: While bicycles are allowed on most transit services, there are some space limitations and, in some cases, times when bicycles are not allowed on board. For specific transit operator policies and procedures go to 511.org and click on the bicycling tab, or call 511 and say "bicycling" to speak to an operator who can answer your questions.

Get Clipper!

Clipper® is the convenient way to pay for transit rides in the Bay Area. The reloadable Clipper card stores value as cash and transit passes to pay your fare on AC Transit, BART, Caltrain, County Connection, Dumbarton Express, FAST, Golden Gate Transit and Ferry, Marin Transit, Muni, Petaluma Transit, SanTrans, Santa Rosa CityBus, San Francisco Bay Ferry, SMART, SolTrans, Sonoma County Transit, Tri-Delta Transit, Vacaville City Coach, Union City Transit, the VINE, VTA, WestCAT, and Wheels.

Whether you pay as-you-go with cash or purchase passes or ticket books in advance, Clipper makes commuting easier. Clipper works with a variety of employee transit benefits providers, including Commuter Check®, WageWorks®, and Clipper Direct®.
